(Mist Blower: Use 1.5 gallons in 6 gallons of water per acre.) Note: Begin application when disease first appears and continue every 10–15 days during rainy season or as is needed. Do not apply when daytime temperatures exceed 80°F as injury may occur. Phytotoxicity may be affected by the quantity of oil used, vigor of trees and temperature at time of application. Bag fruits, or use a directed spray on unbagged fruits. Bagged fruit improves crop safety whereas unbagged fruit may show phytotoxicity.
